THE PROJECT

Let'sGOv - GOverning the Transition through Pilot Actions is a two-year project coordinated by the Municipality of Bologna participating in the NetZero Cities Pilot Programme, a two-year programme financed by the European Union within the Mission for 100 climate neutral and smart cities by 2030.

Bologna, Bergamo, Florence, Milan, Padua, Parma, Prato, Rome and Turin are the nine Italian cities taking part in this European 'Mission' and that, together with the technical-scientific partners University of Bologna, AESS and Energy Center of the Polytechnic of Turin, will test in Let'sGOv, innovative governance actions in their cities to accelerate the path towards decarbonisation.

OBJECTIVES

Reduce emissions from energy consumption in the cities involved through the exploration of innovative governance models, both within municipalities and between municipalities and external actors, in order to

- 1 **consolidate the energy transition and climate neutrality** as structural and transversal objectives of the municipalities involved, through internal capacity building and by fostering the transition towards cross-sectoral climate governance;
- 2 **create new alliances** with stakeholders and citizens to address the energy transition in a systematic way;
- 3 strengthen multi-level governance;
- 4 **explore new financing instruments** to support the transition.

CHALLENGES

Three macro areas, corresponding to the challenges common to the 9 cities, are the focus of the project's action:

- 1 **Area of Engagement**: models of involvement of citizens and different public and private actors relevant to the energy transition, for greater awareness of issues/potentialities, information sharing and the creation of a more effective multi-level ecosystem to support the energy transition;
- 2 **Area of Data**: models of data sharing in the energy field to support decision-making, planning and timely monitoring of interventions and strategies;
- 3 **Area of Financing**: innovative financing models to support the energy transition.
